Peterborough City Council Childcare Funding Criteria

2 Year Old Free Early Education

If your child is between 2 and 3 years of age, you have an income below £16,190 and are claiming one of the following benefits, you could be eligible for a free early education place with a childcare provider:

- Income Support
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance
- Child Tax Credit
- National Asylum Seekers Support
- Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- Employments and Support Allowance - Income Related only
- Working Tax Credit (with a family income of less than £16,190 as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs)

3 and 4 Year Old Free Early Education

All three and four year old children can get 15 hours per week of free childcare and early years education, for 38 weeks per year. This is a total of 570 hours of free early education each year. Your child can start free childcare in the term following your child's third birthday, for a maximum of six terms before your child's fifth birthday. This offer is fully inclusive of all children.

A child born on or between:	Will be eligible for a free place from:
1 April and 31 August	1 September following their third birthday
1 September and 31 December	1 January following their third birthday
1 January and 31 March	1 April following their third birthday

Additional 15 hours

From September 2017, working parents with a three or four-year-old child will be entitled to an additional 570 hours of childcare per year, meaning their three or four-year old will be able to receive up to 1,140 hours free childcare and early education.

You may have heard of this as “**30 hours free childcare**”. Three and four-year-olds in eligible working families will get an additional 15 hours free childcare, equalling 30 hours free per week over 38 weeks of the year (term-time) or approximately 22 hours per week each week of the year.

Both parents must be in work as defined below, or for single parent families, the sole parent must be at work.

‘In work’ is defined as being in employment (including self-employed) and earning at least the equivalent of 16 hours per week at National Minimum Wage or National Living Wage (from April 2017, this is £112.80 per week for 21 to 24-year-olds and £120.00 per week for over 25-year-olds).

Each parent must earn less than £100,000 per year.

Applications for the additional hours must be made to HMRC online at www.gov.uk. If you are successful, you will be issued with a code which you must provide to your chosen childcare provider.
